## 4-H CONFERENCE CENTER SUMMER STAFF OPPORTUNITIES

The Summer of 2009 is just around the corner! The 4-H Conference Center provides an opportunity for you to work in an atmosphere where you will not only impact the lives of young people, but also learn a lot about yourself and make life long friends.

Each position provides valuable leadership training, work experience, fun and profit for individuals who truly desire to be part of a positive summer experience for over 2,500 youth.



Requirements of applicants:

- Successful completion of one year of college or other work by June 1, 2009
- Be enthusiastic, creative, hardworking and dependable
- Be able to get along with others and work as a team
- Be available May 18— August 6

### Available Positions

**Program Assistant:** Will receive on-the-job training in assigned teaching area such as archery, riflery, canoeing, crafts, dance, challenge course, drama, swimming or others as identified. Program Assistants have primary responsibility for two specific areas and are responsible for developing teaching plans, securing and maintaining inventory, supervision of activity, and equipment maintenance. Assist with other duties as assigned.

**Program Assistant/Lifeguard:** Lifeguard certification through American Red Cross required (may be obtained during staff training in May); previous experience preferred. Responsibilities include life guarding, teaching water safety, daily pool maintenance, and assisting with other duties as assigned.

**The above positions are employed from May 18 through August 6, 2009. Housing and meals are provided, residential status is required.**



**Counselors:** Employed from June 25— August 6, 2009. Required to attend training May 18-29, 2009. These positions allow for flexibility for attending the first session of summer school, provided the classes are completed by or within the first week of July.

Duties include:

- Acting as the leader for the youth assigned to the counselor's dorm.
- Helping teaching educational and recreational programs for specified activities.
- Coordinating activities with County Extension Agents and adult volunteer leaders serving as

chaperones.

- Devoting full time to July camps: County Camp, Prime Time and SpecTra. Time off will vary, depending on scheduled programs.

**Salaries:** Summer staff are employees of the Texas A&M University System and are paid bi-weekly, including the two weeks of required training. Room and board is provided along with staff shirts, CPR and First Aid certification, lifeguard certification, and other miscellaneous items.



**Internships:** The Texas 4-H Conference Staff will work with any student to complete required tasks towards earning internship credit at their respective college or university.
